## REPORT FROM EXECUTIVE PRESBYTER CRE Tony De La Rosa, Executive Presbyter

### Dear Friends:

We live in a time of exceedingly high anxiety. Climate change, the burgeoning presence of artificial intelligence, wars abroad, threats at home, mass migration, demographic changes, social value shifts, political upheaval, the rise of white Christian nationalism, and the decline of church vitality has us all on edge. As church leaders, we strive to place these sea changes in the context of our faith that though chaos may threaten, but it does not rule the day. God is sovereign and in charge.

Nevertheless, even leaders succumb to widespread anxiety, and often to their detriment. Folks in charge are supposed to address all that ails and undermines us because they have access to the resources and agency to impact our institutional well-being. When they fail to meet our expectations, we react—unfairly—against them. Acrimony focused on the leader trying to navigate us through the rocky seas is very often misplaced. Emotional energy is being foisted on the wrong party, and pastoral leaders know this all too well!

Two recent changes that our presbytery has had to face this year have been dictated by forces beyond us. The first, the upgrade of the Church Leadership Connection last year caused confusion and undue rancor as an entirely new search engine and database tailored to accommodate the myriad of inter-council permissions available under our post-nFoG polity was rolled out. Bugs needed to be worked out and there were frustrating glitches, to be sure, but technological upgrades always entail bugs and glitches. Unfortunately, CLC staff at the Office of the General Assembly were on the receiving end of a great deal of acrimony and critique for their efforts for several months after the rollout, and some that negativity continues to today. Yet I am pleased to report that several of our pastoral searches in Salem Presbytery using the new CLC system have been conducted successfully and with relatively few hiccups. The result of these searches is slated to be formally recognized at this meeting of our Presbytery.

The second, of course, has been the rollout of the Board of Pensions' benefits re-design for 2025. As has been apparent for some time from social media, few initiatives from the Board have resulted in such overt expressions of disdain and discord. Board officials have been accused of all manner of objectionable motivations as they try to keep an otherwise unsustainable benefits plan available to its members. At a recent meeting of mid council leaders in Philadelphia, Board leadership continued

to be excoriated for their efforts. What few chose to recognize were the efforts of the Board to maintain and expand coverage options while at the same time seeking to control costs for congregations. Plan members and key church financial representatives are urged to register and attend one of informational gatherings on May 15 in Statesville, Greensboro, or Burlington to learn about these developments and determine with precisely how—if at all—the Board's benefits plan redesign will affect their medical coverage and church finances.

As I noted in my prior communications, our <u>real</u> concern is with the sorry state of the American health care system and detrimental policies that undergird it. It behooves us as leaders to work to make that system and all of Creation "an Exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven" to which our Great Ends of the Church calls us to exhibit.

May it be so.

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! The church calendar celebrates the Easter season as 50 days, however, in the world of transformational ministry we are always living into the promises of Easter, where hope overcomes despair and life begins anew.

For us transformation also comes with Good Friday experiences. Another of our churches, Flat Rock Presbyterian, has voted to dissolve. It painful to accept that any church – especially when it was the church where grew up or were married or celebrated the baptisms of your children or parents/grandparents built— is no longer viable. It comes with hard realities

many tears. We take some comfort in recognizing that it is also sacred ground for transformative ministry that Jesus demonstrated to us at the resurrection.

In that transformative light, Shallowford Presbyterian is looking to undertake a bold new call with a bivocational pastor. Bivocational ministry is an old thing somewhat being made new again. It was common up until the 1950s when many denominations began to prioritize seminary education. In smaller congregations it is how most of the world's Christians are experiencing church – and is projected to become the new norm. If you/your congregations have/know of folks with backgrounds in 1) entrepreneurship, 2) non-profit administration, and 3) restaurant or service station management, please reach out as soon as possible to Wes Pitts or me. This is a chance to live into our relational connectedness at its best!





And speaking of that tie which binds us as PCUSA...this past month the Kindred Sisters Cooperative Congregations ministry (Pine Ridge and Hills) ran into an unexpected and urgent need regarding a compassionate care issue in their local ministry. Two installed churches (from other parishes!) and an Engagement Pastor stepped up to assist in resolving the immediate crisis. Additionally, one of our installed

church's vibrant music ministries is considering how to support churches throughout the Presbytery who are without musical or choral accompaniment. Thanks be to God!

When I meet with our uninstalled Sessions, I ask them to remember their story, who and Whose they are. This lays the foundation for inviting the Spirit into the conversation as they lean into their next chapter in God's story. The same applies for our Presbytery.

In resurrection light, may we *together* reflect on, embrace, and support each other in considering what 'transformational ministry, vital mission, and dynamic leadership' looks like for our congregations in this next chapter of our Presbytery's faith story. With a grateful heart to be serving with you!

### Synod of the Mid-Atlantic - Review of Presbytery Minutes

Salem Presbytery's 2022 minutes were reviewed by Stated Clerk Cam Murchison (Western North Carolina Presbytery). (I was assigned to review Abingdon Presbytery's minutes.) Dr. Murchison determined that I did not post notice in 2022 of the successful review of the 2021 minutes. Hence, I'm being certain here that you are notified of the review of 2022! #### **Dismissal of Minister Member**

A task force of the COM charged with following-up with Members-At-Large told me that the Rev. Samuel Dansokho (formerly of the Hood Seminary faculty) had moved to Canada and joined the United Church of Canada. I researched this matter and had a telephone conversation with the United Church of Canada's general administration; Dr. Dansokho is indeed on the roll of that denomination. I have reported this to the Office of the General Assembly (PCUSA) and we have removed him from the Salem and PCUSA rolls.

The packet for this meeting contains the annual Presbytery directory, which I am required to publish. Please note that this roster includes Presbyterians only; we are grateful for those of other denominations who are faithfully serving our churches.

## COMMISSIONER REPORT FROM SYNOD OF THE MID-ALTANTIC Rev. Felicia Stewart Hoyle and Elder Lee Woods

Elder Lee Woods reported on the 253<sup>rd</sup> Assembly of the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic held at Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, Virginia March 15-16, 2024. Highlights from the Assembly included a celebratory farewell to longtime administrator Tami Scott, inspired worship, a call for repair and reparation particularly in African American communities. The critical shortage of Black clergy and the decline of Black congregations were also topics discussed during the Assembly.

## PEACE AND JUSTICE TASK FORCE Elder Beth Hooten, Committee Member

Elder Beth Hooten gave a reminder about the upcoming Racial Equity Training sessions taking place May 29<sup>th</sup> and October 8th. The next book for the book club is entitled "Poverty, By America" by Matthew Desmond. Elder Hooten discussed that the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Durham, NC has petitioned the NC legislature to pass NC House Bill 271 which restricts cash bail for Class 3 Misdemeanors. Additionally, the First Presbyterian Church petitioned the Presbytery of New Hope to endorse the passage of NC House Bill 271. The Session encourages the Presbytery to encourage

each church session in the Presbytery of New Hope to adopt this resolution and to contact their state representatives and Senators. Furthermore, the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery convey this stand to every NC Representative, Senator, and the Governor. The Stated Clerk is directed to communicate this resolution to the Presbyteries of Western North Carolina, Coastal Carolina, Salem, and Charlotte for consideration and adoption.

#### **Faith Journey Statement**

Rev. Dr. James E. Lunde, II

I am a life-long Presbyterian, raised in the First Presbyterian Church in Lansing, MI. As a child of the church, I understand my journey of faith within the particular communities where my faith has developed. My home congregation helped me feel a sense of belonging as a child of God and understand God's abiding presence while my family and I grieved the loss of my father at a young age. This congregation also encouraged me to respond to God's call to serve the church as a Deacon, on our presbytery's youth committee, and also as a small group leader for the Massanetta Springs Middle School Conference. These experiences made me excited about the connectional nature of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) as well as energized about the possibility of serving the church. In college, I received a summer internship grant from the Lilly Endowment to discern a call to ministry while serving as the camp chaplain at Massanetta Springs. This experience encouraged me to apply to seminary to further explore my call to ordained parish ministry.

I attended Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, VA and truly enjoyed this time for theological and spiritual growth. Following graduation, my first call was to the Lake Fellow in Parish Ministry Pastoral Residency program at Second Presbyterian Church, Indianapolis, IN. I was ordained to this two-year residency position and had the opportunity to gain further experience in virtually every area of the church's ministry while serving alongside experienced pastors. This experience allowed me to become a more confident preacher, form effective habits in ministry, establish mentor relationships, and instill the importance of sustaining my own spiritual practices in the midst of ministry.

Following my residency, I served as pastor of Graystone Presbyterian Church in Knoxville, TN. The saints of Graystone taught me the power of showing up for one another in prayer and fellowship while genuinely seeking to understand and love one another despite our respective differences, quirks, and shortcomings. During this pastorate, my wife and I also welcomed our first child (of two) into the world. This congregation not only extended love to my family in this time, but they also extended me grace and encouraged me to balance my responsibilities as a pastor, parent, husband, and child of God.

Currently, I serve as the Pastor of Warrenton Presbyterian Church in Warrenton, VA. As a congregation in close proximity to Washington, D.C., this community has taught me how to find ways to connect in faith and fellowship across the various divides in our world. During this pastorate, I also completed a Doctor of Ministry degree at Union Presbyterian Seminary that provided me an

opportunity for continued study and growth. My final project focused on how the work of preaching can bring biblical and theological insights into conversation with contemporary practices regarding money and possessions.

Throughout my faith journey, I have experienced God's abiding presence within the life of the church. As I discern a call to serve a new congregation, I look forward to the ways my faith will continue to develop while serving the church.

#### Statement of Faith

Rev. Dr. James E. Lunde, II

I believe in the one living and sovereign God, creator of heaven and earth, who is known in three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Humans were created in God's own image to have a special relationship with God. We continuously turn away from God through our sin, which affects every part of ourselves and leaves us unable to follow God's will on our own. This relationship between God and humanity was and is broken through sin; yet, throughout covenant history, God has continued to act graciously toward us by taking the initiative to seek us out, reconciling us with God and with one another.

The ultimate example of God's reconciling grace is in the sending of God's only Son, Jesus Christ into the world—being truly God and truly human. Jesus proclaimed God's reign, healed the sick and friended the outcast. Dying on the cross, Jesus suffered the depths of human pain and defeated the power of sin—reconciling us with God and one another. Rising from the grave, Christ defeated the power of death—giving us hope for life eternal with God. Ascending to the right hand of the Father, Jesus stands as Lord and head of the church through which his abiding love continues to guide and strengthen us. As we await Christ's return, we participate in his ministries of love, justice, and peace through the power of God's sent Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit has inspired God's children throughout human history to do God's will in the world. The Spirit justifies us by grace through faith and empowers us to grow more and more into the image of Christ. Through our reading of scripture and preaching, we are dependent upon the Spirit to make it God's Word to us in our particular time and place. Scripture is the authoritative witness for governing the church, as it helps us discern who God is and how we are to live in relationship with God and one another. The Spirit unites us with Christ in the Sacraments, making Christ truly present in these acts. Sacraments are the visible signs of an invisible reality in which the covenant of grace is sealed and enacted within us. Baptism represents the washing away of our sin, our entrance into the covenant community and our dying and rising to life eternal. Communion represents the continual nourishment that Christ's life, death, and resurrection offer us. It is the food and drink of life eternal, that draw us closer with Christ and with one another as Christ's body.

The church, empowered by the Holy Spirit, is centered on praising the living God. In our ministries of compassion and justice, the church reaches out to the wider community: welcoming the stranger, advocating for the oppressed and feeding the hungry. We do this not for our own merit, but out of gratitude for the God who has continually reached out to us in grace. As the church, we eagerly await the culmination of God's reign and ultimate victory over all which opposes God's love and all will be one in Christ Jesus our Lord.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

### Motion:

That Salem Presbytery withdraw its concurrence to Overture 026 (GAEC-26) on Realigning Self-Development of People.

#### Rationale:

The overture from Pacific Presbytery raises the important issue of the work of the church regarding repair. Unfortunately, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has a history of affirming the need for repair, without providing the resources to engage in this important ministry. The overture from Pacific Presbytery aims to correct this historical lack. However, the overture's proposed solution relies on a misunderstanding of the work and purpose of the Self Development of People (SDOP) which will hinder the work of repair.

SDOP was created in 1970 by the United Presbyterian Church, U.S.A. to carry out the work toward the self-development of economically poor, oppressed, and disadvantaged people who own, control, and benefit directly from projects that promote long-term change in their lives and communities. This mandate was reaffirmed following unification in at the 1987 General Assembly. SDOP was never intended to serve as the reparations arm of the church, nor was it designed to provide grants directly to congregations. Rather, SDOP funds are used for projects and programs of businesses and non-profits "which contribute to social and economic

justice; stimulate self-help and self-determination; further local initiative and incentive" (Minutes of the 182<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly (1970) of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America). The reallocation of \$5 million in 2025 and \$1 million per year for the following twenty-five years would dismantle the historic and vital ministry of SDOP.

Thankfully there are other ministries of the PC(USA) equipped and called to engage in the reparative work this overture calls for. Racial Equity and Women's Intercultural Ministries (RE&WIM) is tasked with walking alongside congregations, communities, and leaders of marginalized communities within the PC(USA). In particular, the Office of African American Intercultural Congregational Support offers grants and other resources to assist and support African American congregations and their leaders. Likewise, the Center for the Repair of Historical Harm, created by the 2022 General Assembly, is called to recognize, acknowledge and repair the harm caused to Indigenous peoples, African Americans and other marginalized groups. RE&WIM and the Center for Repair would be appropriate ministries to take on the important work called for in the overture without dismantling the necessary work being done by SDOP.

The deadline for submitting concurrences and comments for the upcoming General Assembly was Saturday, May 11. Since we are unable to nuance our support of the overture from Pacific Presbytery by indicating support for the work and funding of repair without damaging the thriving ministry of SDOP, Salem Presbytery should withdraw its concurrence from this overture.

## Appendix D Salem Presbytery Retirement

## The Rev. Kellie JoAnne Browne

Kellie Browne's journey to Ministry of Word and Sacrament in the PCUSA followed some roads less traveled. Born in Toronto, Kellie has described her family of origin as "nominally Anglican." After marrying in the United Church of Canada and starting a family, she and her husband Richard moved to Maryland. New neighbors invited them to a Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Kelly felt that God had been waiting for her there. She became actively involved in church, was ordained deacon and elder, and worked in three different congregations as the family relocated. In North Carolina, her family began to worship at Oak Ridge Presbyterian Church. At age 40 Kellie felt called to Ministry of Word and Sacrament and began working on her B.A. in history at Guilford College. Upon graduation, she enrolled at Wake Forest School of Divinity.

After completing her M.Div. degree and having been recommended as a dedicated and organized mid-life minister, in 2010 Kellie accepted a call to John Calvin Presbyterian Church in Salisbury, the "small church with a large heart." Being a solo pastor, she performed a variety of tasks-- planning worship and preaching weekly, along with administration and pastoral care. As is typical of pastors serving aging congregations, Kellie conducted many funeral services at John Calvin. She is known for making each one exceptionally personal and appropriate. Kelly is also remembered for sharing her artistic talents with the congregation.

Kellie's administrative skills have benefited the larger church as well as John Calvin PC. She served as co-moderator of Salem Presbytery's Commission on Ministry. In that capacity she worked with other Salem congregations and pastors. As a member of the Executive Committee of the American Waldensian Society, she was instrumental in planning a trip to study immigration with faculty of the Waldensian Seminary in Rome in 2013. Several pastors and two executives from Salem Presbytery participated in that trip. In Salisbury, Kellie volunteered with Rowan Hospice and Palliative Care. Currently she serves on the Wake Forest University School of Divinity Board of Visitors.

Kellie has been a ready listener and supportive friend to her colleagues in ministry, always willing to share the trials that ministry inevitably brings. While serving John Calvin PC, Kellie regularly participated in the Rowan Presbyterian pastors' monthly luncheons. She initiated and coordinated bi-weekly gatherings of local clergy women of various denominations for coffee and conversation. At one of these gatherings Kellie learned that the Piedmont Unitarian Universalist Church had outgrown the space they rented from Temple Israel which, at the time, was next door to John Calvin PC. In keeping with John Calvin's emphasis on outreach and interfaith alliances, Kellie facilitated getting permission for PUUC to use John Calvin's outbuilding (AKA "the hut") for their children's religious education.

In 2016 Kellie resigned from her position at John Calvin. Soon thereafter she moved with her husband to Winston-Salem and now spends most of her time being Nana. However, she has continued to be active in the presbytery as a minister-at-large, attending Trinity PC in Winston- Salem where she assists with worship and other activities as needed. No doubt she will continue to fulfill her calling to serve Christ and his church under the new status of "retired."

#### The Rev. Dr. Jill Y. Crainshaw

On the occasion of her retirement from the Salem Presbytery, we celebrate and give thanks for the ministry of the Rev. Dr. Jill Y. Crainshaw. Jill will continue her role in the School of Divinity at Wake Forest University.

As Jill's colleague at both Wake Forest School of Divinity and the Salem Presbytery, I have had the privilege of witnessing her profound impact on our community firsthand. Jill has brought her delightful and surprising curiosity and creativity, a depth of theological understanding, a profound commitment to social justice, a passion for integrating worship leadership, liturgical theology, and spirituality, and a dedication to the integrity and ethical standards of our ministry to enhance clergy education, spiritual formation, and the Presbytery's ministry to its congregations.

A distinguished theologian and liturgical scholar, Jill serves in validated ministry as a Professor of Worship and Liturgical Theology and Vice Dean for Faculty Development at Wake Forest University School of Divinity. She obtained her Bachelor of Arts from Wake Forest University and a Master of Divinity from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. She was first ordained in the Baptist tradition and later received as a member of the Presbytery of Shenandoah. In 1987, having earned the MDiv degree, Jill was called to be the first woman pastor of Neriah Baptist Church in Buena Vista, VA, where she served for six years; at the same time, she was chaplain for the Hospice of the Rapidan for two years. Jill also served as a pastoral care consultant at Buena Vista Presbyterian Church in Buena Vista and assistant chaplain at Sunnyside Presbyterian Retirement Community in Harrisonburg, VA. Jill earned her doctorate at Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond in 1998.

In 1999, Jill was called to the Wake Forest School of Divinity as its first Director of Vocational Development and Continuing Education. In her faculty role at the School, Jill has taught various courses in preaching and worship leadership that explore creative and contextually relevant approaches to worship throughout the liturgical year. She has developed and offered courses in ministerial ethics; food, health, and ecological well-being; and Christian spirituality, among many others. For many years, Jill served as the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs and later as Acting and Interim Dean of the School of Divinity. Jill also led the School's worship leadership team, which designs the School's weekly student-led community worship services.

Jill has shared her considerable gifts to advance the work of our Presbytery. She has served in various roles on the Salem Presbytery's COM, including as a member of the Salem-First Presbyterian Conciliation Team; as the Presbytery's representative to the North Carolina Council of Churches; as the Presbytery's liaison to various congregations in pastor search processes; and on many administrative commissions for the ordination of Wake Divinity students and others. She has provided many workshops and consultations to Salem Presbytery ministers at various stages of their careers and interim ministry to Salem congregations, including Clemmons and Trinity Presbyterian Churches. For many years, Jill proctored the PC(USA) ordination exams at Wake Forest School of Divinity. Crucially, Jill led the Presbytery's efforts to improve clergy well-being, developing and leading trainings for Salem leaders on strengthening professional boundaries.

Jill has been a wise and generous mentor to me and many of our colleagues. As my predecessor in theological field education at Wake Forest, Jill has graciously created spaces for sharing her wisdom and exploring our shared experiences as teachers, administrators, and pastors. I am deeply grateful for her collegiality, mentorship, and friendship.

When Jill transferred to the Salem Presbytery in 1999, she wrote: "In a time when many have concluded that the church is a crumbling institution, I am committed to re-capturing the church's vision of a world redeemed by participating in the renewal of its communal life. I am dedicated to the continued transformative potential of the Church to mediate to the world the love and grace of Christ." Jill's work in the School of Divinity and the Salem Presbytery has amply demonstrated this commitment, for which the church is deeply grateful.
